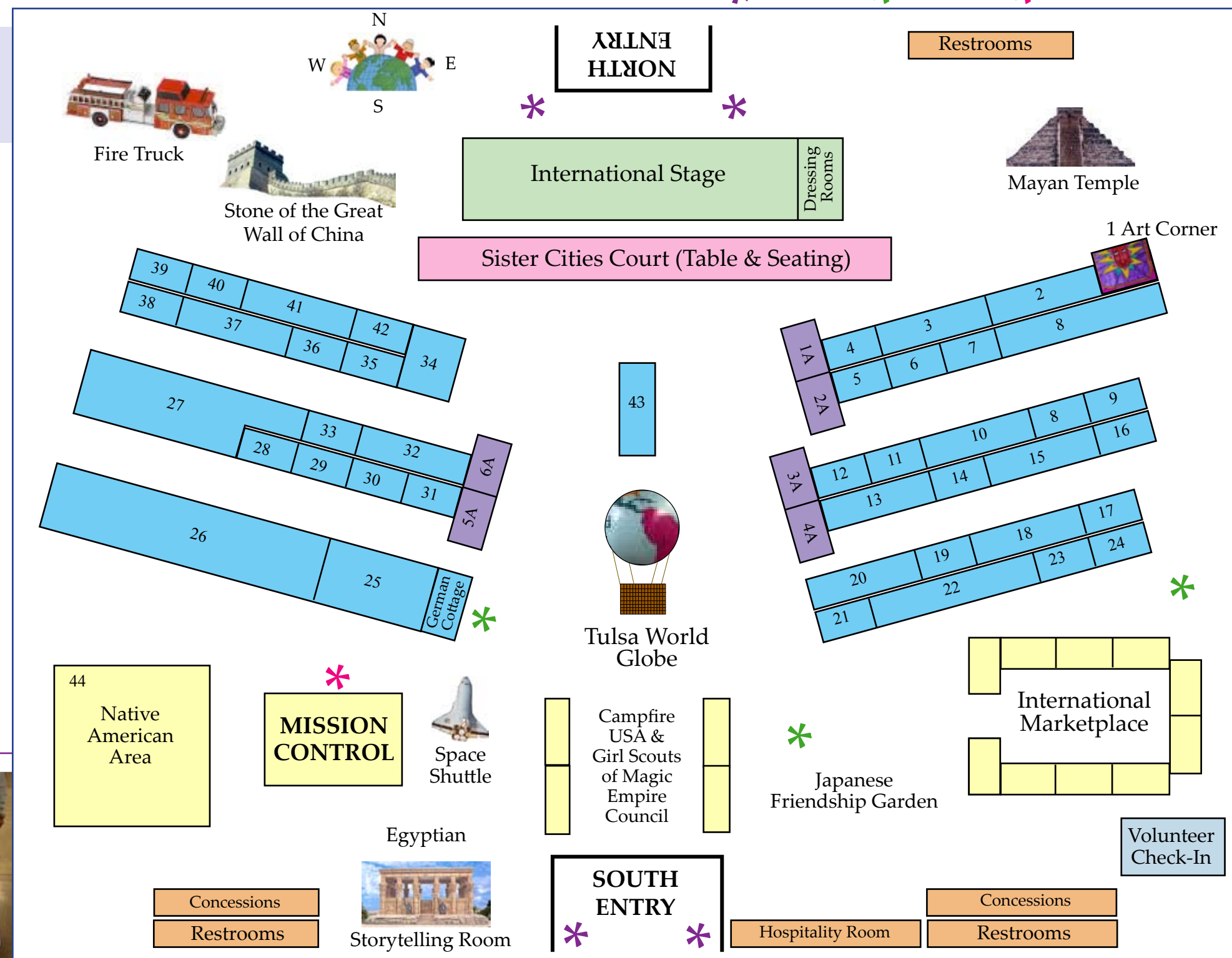

Marketplace

Egyptian Storytelling Room

Discover the treasures of reading, as you enter the storytelling room through an Egyptian archeological find. Hear storytellers weave wondrous tales from around the world throughout the festival. Schedule will be located outside storytelling room entrance.

Sister Cities International Young Artists Winners

Once again, Kids' World will display the award-winning artwork from the Sister Cities International Young Artists Competition. See artwork by the international top ten finalists, including Qin Lue, of Tulsa's Chinese Sister City Beihai. Her art ranked top 10 in the competition two years in a row.

Japanese Friendship Garden

Stepping stones will lead the way to a garden pond with a traditional bamboo water feature called a "shishi-doshi" or deer scare. The water flowing from the shishi-doshi will cascade over the pond stones to replicate in spirit the serenity notable of Japanese gardens.

Stone from the Great Wall of China

See a piece of the Great Wall of China that was presented to Tulsa by the People's Republic of China as a sign of friendship in 1988. The grey stone, weighing 100 pounds, is inscribed "Ming-Dynasty-1566" and came from a watch tower along the Wall near Juyongguan Pass outside Beijing. The Great Wall of China, constructed entirely by hand, is the longest structure ever built, extending nearly 4,000 miles. Construction of the Wall began in the 400s B.C. and continued until A.D. 1600s.
