EDUCATION IN MWANZAFrequently Asked Questions

1) Generally describe the education system.

OVERVIEW:

Mwanza City council follows The Tanzanian educational system that operates on the 7-4-2-3 system: 7 years of primary school, followed by 4 years of secondary school (Ordinary Level) leading to 2 years of Advanced Level. After the 13th year of secondary school students may take the Advanced Certificate exam and attend college for 3 to 4 years. While the national language in Tanzania is Swahili, English is taught, along with Swahili, Math and Science, in Primary Schools. Secondary School students are only taught in English in most of their subjects.

PRIMARY SCHOOL:

Primary School, teach all subjects in Kiswahili, the education is free, but the costs covered by students are school uniforms and some school supplies. Students begin in standard one at age 7 and start learning English in standard 3.

National exams are required to move forward beginning after standard 4 and a passing score on the standard 7 exams determine where the student will be placed in secondary school.

New Curriculum for Primary School Starting from 2024, All Public Primary schools in Tanzania will begin to operate under a New Curriculum which will take shape as follows:

- 1st Stage Pre Primary School: This will recruit pupils from Age 1-5 and will be for a period of 1 year. Pupils will be taught how to Read, Write and Count/Simple Math. On top of this pupils will be taught How to build relationship between themselves and their parents, learn how to interact in the society, Patriotism, Simple ICT basics.
- 2nd Stage- Standard One: This will comprise pupils of 6-7 years and it will for one years after Pre Primary Stage. They will be enhanced on Reading, Writing and Simple Maths. English subject will be added and they will be taught simple English basis like Greetings and Personal Introduction. ICT and Patriotism will also be enhanced with a purpose of becoming a better citizen.
- 3rd Stage Standard 3-6: This stage Pupils will start learning subjects like English, Math, Swahili, Science and Technology, The History of Tanzania and other languages like French, Arabic, Chinese(if available). Moreover pupils will also be taught Vocational Training like Mechanics, Music and Arts, Sculpturing, Use of Sewing machine. When this stage is completed, pupils will then join Secondary School, and if a pupil will ascend well in Vocational studies, he/she will Major in vocational studies with an addition of English, Swahili and Math.

SECONDARY SCHOOL:

Secondary school is divided into ordinary, Form 1 -4, and advanced, Form 5-6 and subjects are taught in ENGLISH!

Students who pass form four exams may move onto Advanced Secondary School which are mostly boarding schools, passing students will go to public schools where education is free except few students' necessities like Uniforms, bed matress, extra circular supplies and learning materials like exercise books.

The exam results dictate the school the student may attend which is chosen by the government. Students who pass form 6 (division 1 being the highest and division 4 the lowest) may continue onto University. Student then will have to apply for University

education within the country and as well apply for Student education loan from the Government Institution of High Education Student Loan's Board (HESLB). The board will then assign percentages of loan to student who qualify. The Student loan will cover for Tuition fees, meals, and education supplies. The University tenures 3 years except for some programs that go up to 4 or 5 Years like Medical Science, Law and Engineering

Students who fail form 4 or form 6 National exams happens to join Advanced Vocational School.

2) Is English taught in schools, and if so at what levels? What other languages are taught in the schools?

As mentioned above, the language of communication in Primary School is Swahili and English is being taught as a subject, this is for Swahili Medium Public Schools while English Medium Public School, English is the medium of communication and Swahili is taught as a subject

In Secondary to University all subjects are taught in English while French, Chinese, Arabic or Korean are languages taught in some secondary schools but not compulsory. English is mandatory.

3) Is there a library system?

Few public schools have Library systems well established. Most of Long existing secondary schools have been running Library systems but not at satisfying standards for students to utilize efficiently. The government places this agenda as a major priority for all schools, while the challenge is inadequate resources to develop the system effectively. Library systems are well developed at University level given the nature and trend of University education where students are required to put extra efforts on the personal studies and findings not to rely on one source of information.

4) Are there tech-trade schools?

The institution that offers tech – trade education in Mwanza is called VETA- Vocational Education and Training Authority under the Ministry of Education Science and Technology. Several tech trainings are offered to students based on the field of their interest such as Mechanics, engineering, Art works, sculpturing, construction, ICT etc.

Another institution is not specifically a university/college but an organization responsible for training small entrepreneurs by capacitating them with skills and knowledge to develop small factories. This organization is called SIDO- SMALL INDUSTRIES DEVELOPMENT ORGANIZATION.
