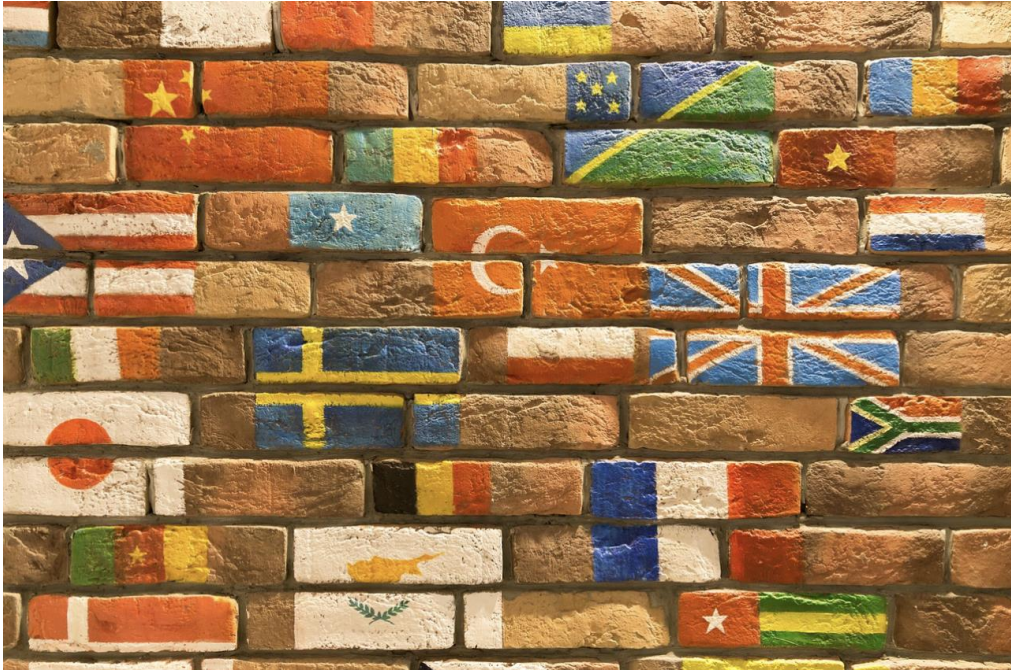

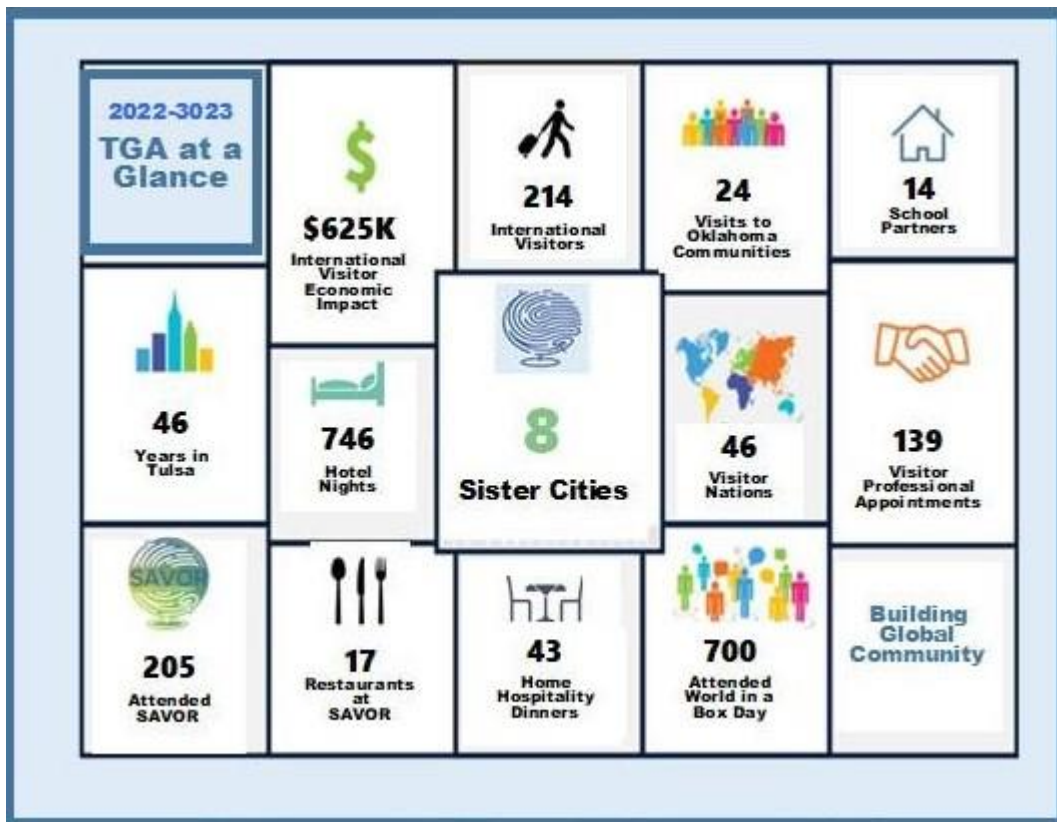

Tulsa - A Community Full of Global Partners

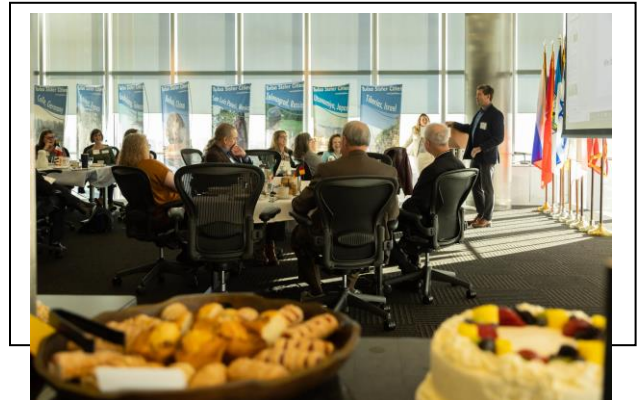

The City of Tulsa and Mayor G.T. Bynum act as strong partners to our mission via the annual contract to coordinate and staff activities involving Tulsa's relationship with its eight International Sister Cities. These programs help promote and provide opportunities for cultural exchange, economic development, and tourism. Banners for our eight International Sister Cities are displayed outside of the Council Chamber on the second floor of City Hall.

The Tulsa City Councilors are considered Honorary Sister City Ambassadors and engage with visitors for special greetings. In the past year, TGA hosted Coffee with the Councilors, an event that brought together City Councilors and the Sister City Chairs. The Councilors and TGA members tasted featured foods from each Sister City. Councilor Decter Wright talked about the importance of having the TGA and sister cities and Councilor Lakin spoke about his experience visiting the sister city he represents, Amiens, France. Ruby Libertus, TGA Board Chair shared opening remarks and welcomed the group in all of the languages represented by our Sister Cities.

Rebuilding Sister City Exchanges

Tulsa Global Alliance manages exchanges and activities between Tulsa and its eight International Sister Cities on behalf of the City of Tulsa. Partnership committees highlight and maintain relations with their overseas counterparts, building true friendships. Our volunteer Sister City Chairs worked hard to rebuild in-person exchanges and activities this year, including:

- Sharing their cultures through hands-on activities at World in a Box Day on August 6, 2022.
- Attending the Coffee with the Councilors event at City Hall on October 26, 2022.
- Representing TGA at Eisenhower International Festival on March 8, 2023.
- Working with the design agency Aqua Vita to create new Sister City Logos.



Amiens, France - Carine Larkin and Wendy Sheets, Partnership Co-Chairs

- TGA arranged for Tulsa Deputy Mayor Cassia Carr, who was in Paris in mid-February, to visit Amiens and meet with Stephanie Dapsance, Head of the European and International Office at the Amiens Métropole.
- In March and April 2023, Edison and Carver welcomed a group of 80 French students from Luzarches and Sagebien, respectively, and the Amiens Partnership financially supported these exchanges, and helped to find host families for the students.
- TGA and Alliance Francaise de Tulsa hosted a luncheon for the principal of Luzarches, Mme Pollet and a reception at Hop the Griffin for Luzarches High School and Edison High School French teachers.
- TGA helped arrange a tour of City Hall for the Luzarches students as well as meetings with City Councilor Phil Lakin and Deputy Mayor Cassia Carr on April 5.

Tulsa-Beihai Partnership at the Asian-American Festival



Beihai, China - Alpha Edens, Partnership Chair

- TGA supported the East Asia Institute at OU's Christmas party at Cleveland Elementary School on December 14, 2022. Tulsa-Beihai Sister City Chair Alpha Edens introduced TGA and distributed materials about Tulsa's Sister City of Beihai.
- The Beihai Partnership represented TGA at various Lunar New Year Celebrations in January and February 2023: Myriad Gardens Foundation, Tulsa Chinese School, Broken Arrow High School Asian Club, and Zarrow International School, as well as the Asian World Experience at OU.
- In March 2023, the Beihai Partnership participated in an Asian Calligraphy demonstration at the Gathering Place and distributed Beihai-related materials to raise awareness of TGA.
- The Beihai Partnership participated in multiple AAPI celebrations in May 2023, including events at the Gathering Place and Nam-Hai Oriental Food Market, the Asian American Festival at Martin Regional Library, and Global Gatherings East Asia.

- The German American Society of Tulsa (GAST) successfully hosted a non-denominational celebration of Advent Sunday on December 11, 2022 with the support of the Tulsa-Celle Partnership.
- In February 2023, Sandy visited the German Consulate in Houston. The trip resulted in new connections and documents to share about work and study in Germany.
- The Tulsa-Celle Partnership supported a series of German cooking classes at GAST, which is open to the public and partially sponsored by the Celle Partnership.
- The Tulsa-Celle Partnership helped host a reception at the German American Society of Tulsa (GAST) for Markus Hatzelman, the Vice Consul of the General Consulate of the Federal Republic of Germany in Houston. She learned about the Consulate's work promoting Germany in the U.S. and talked with Markus about his first trip to Oklahoma and the work he's doing in Oklahoma with Governor Stitt.
- The Tulsa-Celle Partnership met with Susanne Reinike from Celle via Zoom on May 20, 2023 with the German American Society of Celle to get to know our counterparts in our Sister City.

- On October 22, 2022, TGA received the "Award of the Americas" for its support of the SLP Sister City partnership at the annual Noche de Gala hosted by the Hispanic American Foundation of Tulsa. Clark Frayser attended the event and accepted the award on behalf of the Partnership.
- Clark, Vivian Wang from TU, Rosalio Martinez from the Hispanic American Foundation, Margarita Vega from Casa de La Cultura, and Alejandro Muñozcano from Tyler Media attended the Festival de Ciudades Hermanas in SLP November 2-6, 2022.
- The University of Tulsa (TU) finalized negotiations with the Autonomous University of San Luis Potosi (SLP) to launch a new JumpStart exchange program for TU students in SLP. Members of TU leadership (Vivian Wang, Bruce Willis, and Jennifer Airey) visited SLP on January 10, 2023 to attend the university's 100th anniversary celebration for its autonomous status, where they formally signed the partnership agreements.

- Clark attended the opening of the Consulate of Mexico in Oklahoma in Oklahoma City on May 20, 2023.



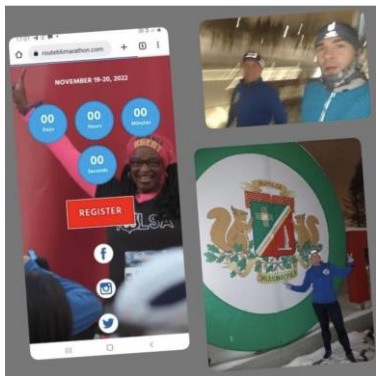

Sister Cities Signs

TGA continues the work of installing Sister Cities directional signs at strategic locations around Tulsa. Following the first signs installed at Tulsa Ports in 2020 and GRC Business Park in 2021, two additional signs were installed in 2022-2023. Through collaboration with the Office of the Mayor, Tulsa City Council, Tulsa Parks Department, River Parks Authority, Tulsa Global District and many others, Tulsa Sister Cities signs are raising awareness of Tulsa's global connections and creating a sense of community pride among Tulsa's diverse citizenry.

TGA dedicated the third Sister Cities directional sign on October 20, 2022 located in River Parks at 68th and Riverside Drive, thanks to sponsorships from Sharon King Davis, The Gelvin Foundation and the Muskogee Nation. The dedication ceremony included remarks by TGA Board Chair Ruby Libertus and City Councilor Jeannie Cue, along with special guests Muskogee Nation Principal Chief David Hill, Del Beaver Muskogee Nation Second Chief, and Muskogee Nation princesses who shared their blessings and culture. TGA Board Chair, Ruby Libertus acknowledged that the land where Tulsa's Sister Cities sign now stands is sovereign land of the Muskogee Nation. Tulsa Global Alliance recognizes and respects the Muskogee Nation as traditional stewards of this land and the enduring relationship that exists between the Muskogee Nation and their traditional territories.

Family, friends, City officials, TGA Sister Cities Chairs, Board members and Staff participated in the dedication ceremony on June 1, 2023 at the newly remodeled McCullough Park near East 25th Street and S. Garnett Road in the Tulsa Global District. The ceremony included remarks by TGA Board Chair, Dr. Ruby Libertus, sign sponsor, Arnie Murillo and Maria Murillo-Sanchez, along with Tulsa Deputy Mayor, Cassia Carr and City Councilor, Chris Bengel. Recreating Global Education Opportunities for Oklahoma's Youth

Global Education

TGA engages with partners such as the Tulsa City-County Library, public and private schools, universities and organizations in structured programs that help broaden the global and cultural horizons of area youth and citizens. Global education is a lifelong process that promotes understanding and appreciation of cultural differences and similarities.

Area Colleges and Universities

The University of Tulsa Vice-Provost for Global Engagement, Vivian Wang, took part in the TGA trip to Tulsa's Sister City of San Luis Potosi, Mexico in November of 2022. As a result, the University of Tulsa signed a partnership agreement with the Autonomous University of San Luis Potosi (UASLP) for the exchange of students and faculty. Dr. Wang said, "I was overwhelmed by the sharing, welcoming sense of community I encountered there. Our university and our city benefit from the strong economic, social and educational ties that TGA fosters."

TGA continues to work closely with TU, Tulsa Community College, the University of Oklahoma – Tulsa Campus, and Oral Roberts University. Our partnerships with area colleges and universities help enhance the community-wide experience of both Oklahoma college students and foreign exchange students.

Culture Boxes

A program of Tulsa Global Alliance in partnership with Eisenhower International School in Tulsa, culture boxes continue to be a great addition to any classroom or organization presentation. Each box contains cultural artifacts, books, musical instruments, fabrics, and other expressions of more than 40 unique countries, regions, and cultures. TGA is grateful to Eisenhower International School, which houses the boxes and coordinates the check-out program.

Passport to Global Cultures—World in a Box Day

Tulsa Global Alliance and our partner, the Tulsa City-County Library, hosted a successful World in a Box Day festival on August 5, 2022, attended by over 700 people. TGA is grateful to the Schusterman Family Philanthropies for its continuing support for global education and World in a Box Day, and to the library for dedicating the 2022 passport to the late Cathy Izzo. Finally, thank you to 2022 event chair Ava Donnelly, co-chair Raashi Karande, to all the exhibitors, entertainers, Sister City partnership chairs, and all of the volunteers who gave their time and effort to bring global education to the people of Tulsa! TGA invites everyone to attend the 2023 World in a Box Day, scheduled for Saturday, August 5 at the Tulsa Central Library.

Eisenhower and Zarrow International Schools

TGA has re-started its program to manage the finances for Eisenhower and Zarrow International Schools' exchange programs with schools in Costa Rica, France, and Spain. Their exchange students will become student members of Tulsa Global Alliance.

Coffee with a Diplomat

TGA hosted career Foreign Service Officer Dan Langenkamp for a "Coffee with a Diplomat" talk at OSU Tulsa, and invited area students at the high school and university level as well as TGA members to meet him. Langenkamp spoke about his career, most recently as Public Information Officer at the U.S. Embassy in Ukraine, and about how to pursue job opportunities with the U.S. Department of State.

Economic Development and International Business

Tulsa Global Alliance's U.S. State Department International Visitor Leadership Program participants met with representatives of many Oklahoma companies, including American Airlines, Baker Hughes, Bama, Covanta, Magellan Midstream Partners, Olifant Energy, T.D. Williamson, and Williams.



Mayor's Consular Summit and Oklahoma World Trade Conference

TGA worked with the U.S. Department of Commerce's Kevin Chambers and with Michelle Barnett and Jonah Toay with PartnerTulsa to host visiting Consuls General in Tulsa for the Mayor's Reception and Oklahoma World Trade Conference in October of 2022. TGA helped to arrange dinner hosts for the Consuls representing India, Israel, and Mexico, and transportation for the Consuls to get from the Tulsa Club Hotel to the Oklahoma World Trade Conference at Tulsa Technology Center. The Consuls from South Korea attended the Sister City sign dedication at River Parks on October 20, and TGA also arranged for them staff to tour the American Airlines Maintenance Base, thanks to TGA Board Member Chase Beasley. Kevin Chambers said that, "By playing a major role in hosting several Consuls General during the recent Oklahoma World Trade Conference in Tulsa, TGA helps Oklahoma and Tulsa make the case for the region being hospitable to foreign investors."

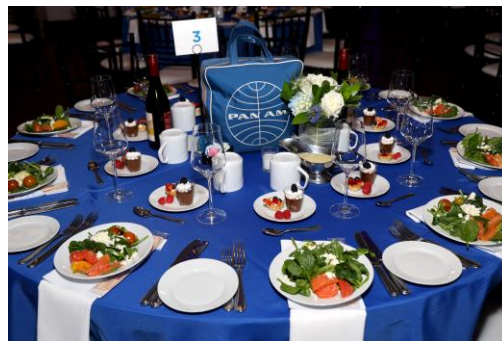

Rebuilding In-Person International Visitor Programs

International Visitor Programs

During the past year, TGA has returned to in-person programming for international visitors, and we have hosted 99 participants in the U.S. State Department International Visitor Leadership Program, 16 delegates through the Congressional Office of International Leadership Open World Program, and 2 Fellows through the Young Southeast Asian Leaders Initiative.

TGA has built relationships with new professional resources, host families, hotels, and transportation providers. Most of TGA's 2022 and 2023 international visitors were required to take COVID tests after their arrival in Tulsa, and TGA is grateful to Morton Clinic for providing this service.

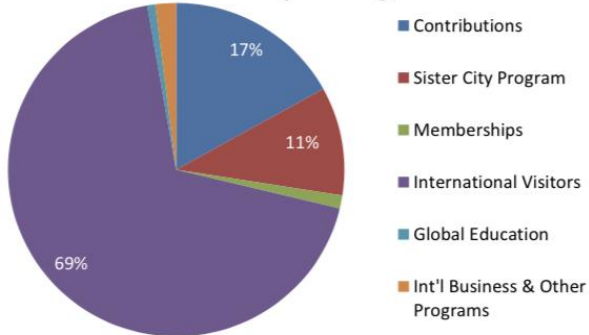

2022 TGA Total Operating Revenue



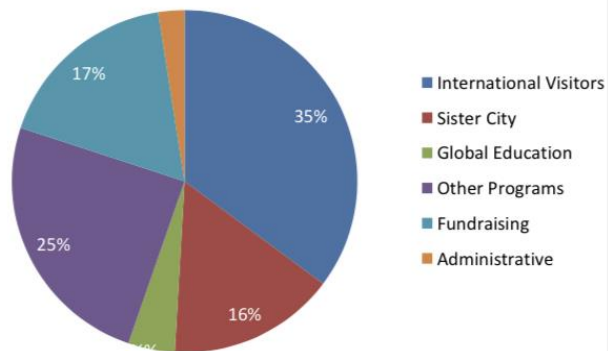
